Reporting Abuse

If you have concerns that a vulnerable adult may be:

- Abused or neglected.
- Living at risk due to neglect or self-neglect.
- Having trouble knowing if they can get support and assistance on their own, and how to go about it, there are several ways to help.

If you discover a crime or a dangerous situation is occurring, call 9 - 1 - 1 to get help immediately.

If the situation is not an emergency: find out if there is anything you can do to help. Call a family member, offer a ride to an appointment, or volunteer to run a few errands.

If the situation is not an emergency and you cannot talk directly to the person you are concerned about and you are worried that they are unable to get help on their own due to physical restraint or some type of physical or mental disability, and then contact Northern Health for help by:

Financial Services

Allowance for the Survivor

French: 1-800-277-9915

If you are a survivor, between the ages of 60 and 64 with low income and you meet the legal status and residence requirements, you may qualify for the Allowance for the Survivor, provided that, you have not remarried since the death of your spouse, or are not presently living in a common-law relationship. Your benefit will be based on your yearly income. The benefit has to be renewed each year, however if seniors file their income tax return on time, renewal can happen automatically. www.esdc.gc.ca/en/cpp/oas/allowance_survivor.page

Canada Pension Plan

French: 1-800-277-9915 Canada Pension Plan (CPP) protects contributors and their families from loss of income due to retirement, disability or death. The retirement benefit can be received as early as age 60. Disability benefits are paid to contributors who are under 65 years of age, who have paid sufficient contributions to the CPP and who are disabled as defined under the CPP Act. Note: You can apply for CPP up to a year before you are eligible to receive it. You should apply at least six (6) months before if possible.

Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS)

The benefit has to be renewed each year, however if seniors file their income tax return on time, renewal can happen automatically.

Old Age Security (OAS) Pension

OAS is a federally funded basic monthly pension paid to you when you reach the age of 65 years if you are a Canadian Citizen or a legal resident of Canada and if you meet the resident requirements. You should apply at least six months before your 65th birthday or the date of your eligibility. Applications are available at: www.servicecanada.gc.ca

OAS Spouse's Allowance

If you are a spouse or partner of someone receiving Old Age Pension and the Guaranteed Income Supplement, you may qualify for an allowance. You must be between the ages of 60-64 and meet the legal status and residence requirements. Your benefit will be based on the combined incomes of you and your spouse/partner. The benefit has to be renewed each year, however if seniors file their income tax return on time, renewal can happen automatically. Applications are available at: www.servicecanada.gc.ca

Senior's Supplement

1 - 866 - 866 - 0800

(Press 4, then 1)

A monthly payment provided by the Province of British Columbia. It ensures a conditionally guaranteed income level for BC residents receiving federal Old Age Security and Guaranteed Income Supplement or federal allowances.

If the income level of an eligible senior's income falls below the level guaranteed by the province, the supplement is provided to make up the difference. Seniors do not have to apply.

Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters (SAFER)

1-800-257-7756

SAFER is a non-taxable rent subsidy program for people who are 55 years or older and are currently paying more than 30% of their income towards rent. To be eligible, seniors 55 years or older must be renting, be entitled to receive Old Age Security, and have lived in BC for one year prior to applying. The applicant or spouse must have resided in Canada for one year.

Seniors aged 55 to 64 must meet all the above requirements and is a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant.

The Medical Services Plan (MSP), a Ministry of Health program administered by Health Insurance BC, insures medically required services provided by physicians and supplementary health care practitioners, laboratory services and diagnostic procedures. It insures part of the cost for the services of podiatrists, chiropractors and physical therapists.

You qualify for the BC Medical Services Plan if your home is in BC and you spend at least six months of each year in the province. New arrivals to BC must wait three months before applying. There is a monthly fee for MSP; lower rates are available to BC residents with a low income.

Power of Attorney: A legal document that gives another person the power to make decisions regarding your legal or financial matters. This can be general or quite specific. It is usually done when a person is physically unable to look after their affairs due to travel or injury, illness, disease, or an accident.

Representation Agreement: A legal document that appoints someone to make decisions for you about finances, health, and/ or personal matters, if you are incapable of making decisions independently. You can choose when or under what circumstances you want the agreement to start. You can also choose different representatives to make different decisions. For example, you may choose your daughter to handle your banking or your son to make medical decisions.

Wills: A document that explains what you want done with the assets that you own solely in your own name, when you die. A will is also your statement on whom and what is important to you. It is very important to consult with a professional and make a Will properly as it is a complex legal document.
